Brian Feist and Skip Easterbrooks win Doubles Tournament

Skip Easterbrooks and Brian Feist are your new Doubles Knockout champions. Finishing 17th with a total of 1216 in the qualifying round, Skip and Brian rolled through most of their knockout round competition with a true team effort. With totals of 230, 271, 299, 291 and 275, they combined for an average of 136. Skip had a five string qualifying score of 623 and a knockout score of 702, while Brian had a five string qualifying score of 593 and a knockout score of 664.

Skip and Brian barely made it out of the first round defeating the team of Mike Kustak and Bob Caliri by 1 pin, 230 – 229. That would be their closest match of the knockout round, and aside from a 13 pin victory over John Zappi and Jeff Surette (299 - 286) in the quarterfinals, they handled each match with relative ease. In

the second round they defeated Joe Tavernese and Jim Putney, 271 – 235. After their quarterfinals victory, they moved on to defeat Lou Alberghini and Stu Bergman, 291 – 223. This set up for a final match that ended up being one-sided, but was on course for a high-scoring, and very exciting, final match.

Leading up to the finals, the team of Eric Pelletier and Chris Boisvert had also run through their opponents. They qualified with 1307 and in 6th place, good enough for a bye to the second round. They tied in the second round 233 – 233, and moved on after combining for a 1 string total of 164. They bowled 291 and 288 in the quarterfinals and semifinals, winning each match by 54 pins and 77 pins respectively. Eric had just bowled back to back 156 strings, and

Chris had two 130 games (135 and 132).

The finals, however, were all about Skip and Brian. Continuing their pace and keeping up their 136 average, they combined for a total of 275 and defeating Eric and Chris by 41 pins.

Finishing first overall after the qualifying round was the team of Bob Whitcomb and Craig Holbrook. They bowled a combined score of 1336, with Whitcomb bowling 651 and Holbrook bowling 685. This is the second consecutive event in which Holbrook has finished in the top 3 in the individual qualifying, earning him another big chunk of points with 175.

With only 4 points in the loss column, the team from Hyde Park, made up of John Zappi, Bob Whitcomb, Craig Holbrook, Mike Cuccia, and Rich Bognano, are in first place, fourteen points ahead of second place. Four teams are currently tied for second place with thirty points: Academy 1, Central 1, Candlewood and Lucky 1. Mike Morgan, Chris Sacchetti, Mark Strangio and Mike Regal are all currently averaging over 130, with Morgan leading the way with 133. He also has the highest three string total for the year with a 432.

A Look Ahead: The 10-Stringer

Our next tournament is a 10-Stringer to be held on October 17, 2010. The tournament will be held at the Big 20 in Scarborough, ME and will be held in three shifts, 10 A.M., 2 P.M., and 6 P.M. In this tournament, members (and non-members) will bowl 10 strings. This is the only tournament where there will be no knockout rounds. Instead of earning points in the knockout rounds, members have an opportunity to earn points every string. Fifty points will be awarded in every string for the high string bowled.
